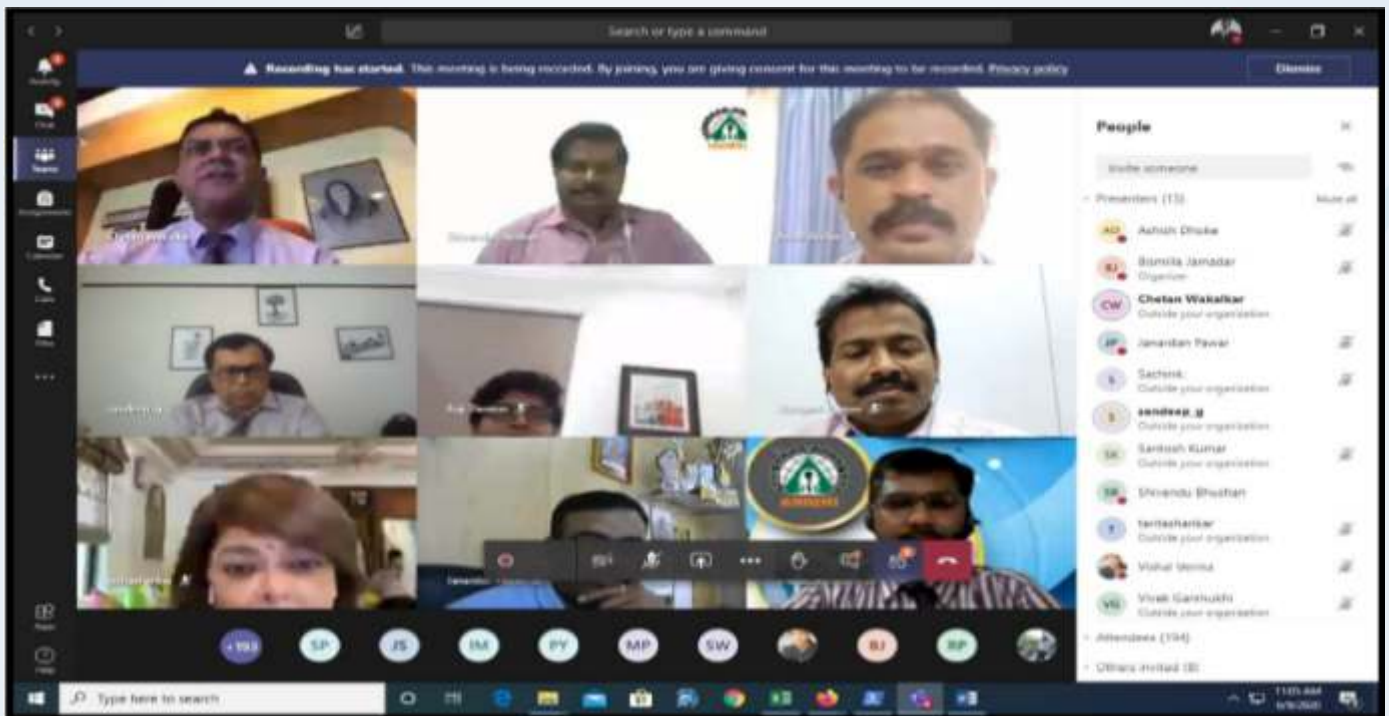
BLOOD DONATION CAMP

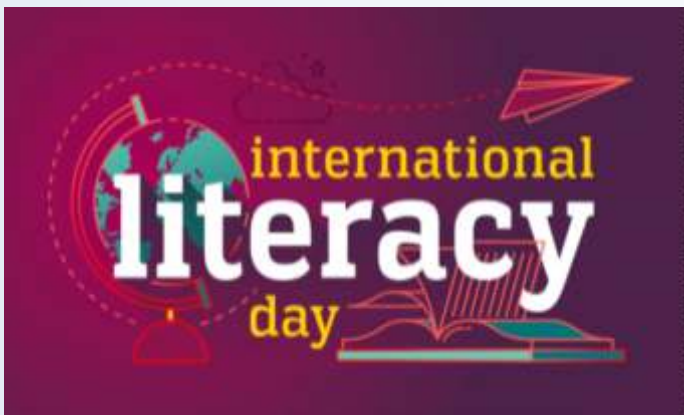
INDUCTION 2020 :

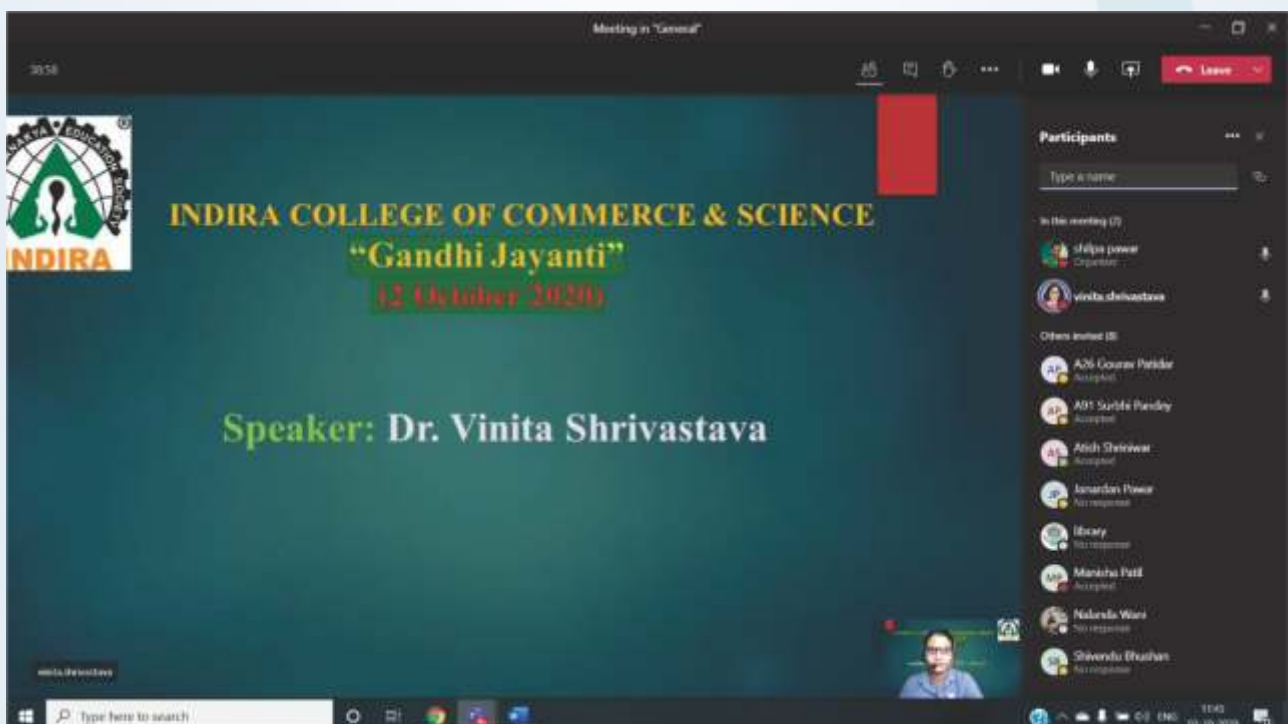

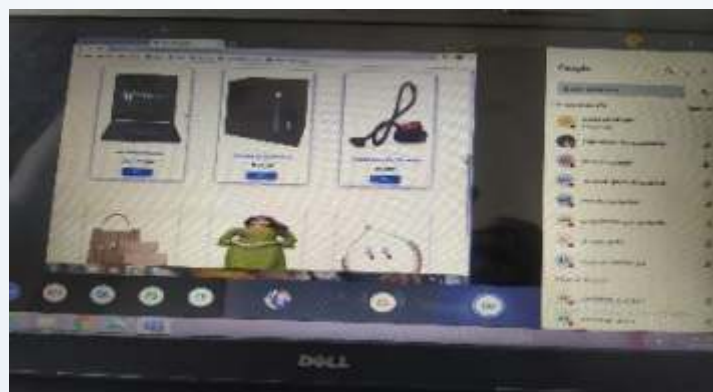


Website designing competition
