INTRODUCTION


Have you ever noticed how female products and services are more expensive than that of men? How by just changing the look of a product to more delicate looking or turning them into pink, makes it more costlier. This has all to do with PINK TAX.

PINK TAX refers to the invisible cost that women have to pay for products designed and marketed specifically to them, while the generic or male equivalent of the same products are available for less. Pink tax isn't an actual tax. This phenomenon is often attributed to gender-based price discrimination, with the stemming from the observation that many of the affected products are pink.

CAUSES

On the surface, it would seem difficult to find a gender tax on products and services. However, on digging deeper one will find clear evidence that women pay twice as much as men. There are many reasons why pink tax exists, including tariffs, product discrimination, and product differentiation. In India we do not have any credible data to show, this arises the argument that pink tax is nonexistent. In the Indian context it would be more apt to say that we have evident gender price discrimination.

One of the main reasons why Twenty One Pilots stand out from other rock/alternative bands is the lyrics. As Tyler says "this one's a contradiction because of how happy it sounds; but the lyrics are so down" in "Not Today", their music does sound happy and upbeat and appealing, but is rather dark and sad when you really pay attention; much like people of today, covering up their struggles behind a smile.

They don't talk about love, breakups, or drugs like a lot of the mainstream music these days. Their lyrics reach people on a whole different level. For people who might not think they're good enough, or who are suicidal, self-harming, depressed, or even just discontent with who they are as a person. To put it simply: they save lives.

The song "Migraine", one of my personal favorites, itself is a metaphor, that puts a voice to the battles of the mind. It describes Tyler trying to escape from his overworking brain, which keeps sending him depressing and pessimistic thoughts. And as a socially anxious introvert who thinks about dying quite a lot, the lyric "sometimes to stay alive, you gotta kill your mind"—along with the waver in his voice—hit me right in the chest, in a way no song has ever affected me before.

Another reason why I (and other fans around the world) love this band so much is because they've helped us find purpose. With the happy shell and sad insides, we still find a hopeful undertone. A big quote shared amongst the Clique (the fanbase) is "Stay Alive"— a powerful message that I feel everybody should understand. It serves as a ray of hope to the fans by encouraging them that life goes on; the curing process for the problems we face will involve killing parts of our mind, but they ensure us that we will make it through.

Twenty One Pilots' music for me is completely honest, executed in an exciting and engaging way, and there is nothing else like it. Tyler and Josh's abilities to pour out their hearts into what they create isn't unique, but their honesty is. And I think that's beautiful.

Home to everyone and everything

When you enter Banaras, you will be greeted and welcomed with chaos, colour, joy, delicious food and lots of affinity. It will all be worth it! You will have a feeling of stepping back in time. If you haven't been to Varanasi even once, you definitely should and here's a few things you can expect.

Varanasi is the India of your imagination. It is one of the world's oldest continually inhabited cities and one of the holiest in Hinduism. Pilgrims come to the Ganges here to wash away sins in the sacred waters, to cremate their loved ones or simply to die here, hoping for liberation from the cycle of rebirth. It is dripping in history and spirituality. It is one of the seven Hindu and Jainist holy cities, or Sapta Puri, in India. Buddhism is said to have been founded in Varanasi as well.

A trip to the Ganges will reveal countless sights that will remain with you long after you leave.

Art

Varanasi is a major centre of arts and designs. It is a producer of silks and brocades with gold and silver thread work, carpet weaving, wooden toys, bangles made of glass, ivory work, perfumes, artistic brass and copper ware and a variety of handicrafts. The cantonment graveyard of the British Raj is now the location of Varanasi's Arts and Crafts.

Literature

Renowned Indian writers who have resided in the city were Kabir, Ravidas, and Tulsidas, who wrote much of his Ram Charit Manas here. Kulluka Bhatt wrote the best known account of Manusmriti in Varanasi in the 15th century. The Cakkavatti Sihanada Sutta text of Buddhism puts forth an idea stating that Varanasi will one day be included. Acharya Shukla, Baldev Upadhyaya, Bharatendu Harishchandra, Devaki Nandan Khatri, Premchand, Hazari Prasad Dwivedi, Jaishankar Prasad, Kshetresra Chandra Chattopandhyaya, Sudama Pandey (Dhoomil), Vagish Shastri, and Vidya Niwas Mishra.

Music

Classical music echoes everywhere. It reminds me of the city's heritage that goes far back in time, a living impression of its ancientness. It is in the temples, the weekly music concerts held in restaurants, in the music played on the ghats and rooftops, in the large-scale annual festivals, in the music shops, and in guesthouses. Sarangi, tabla, shehnai, tanpura, sitar, sarod, santoor, and flute form a part of Kashi's legacy, left behind by virtuosos like Pandit Ravi Shankar, Pandit Gopal Mishra, Ustad Bismillah Khan, and Girija Devi all previous residents.

Festival

Here is a list of festivals that you should definitely celebrate in Varanasi.

1. GANGA MOHOTSAV - Ganga Mahotsav is one of the most popular Varanasi festivals. This is believed among the people of Varanasi that the holy river Ganga provides nourishment and life to the entire civilization that has made their homes around the pious river Ganges. Each year, the famous Ganges festival or Ganga Mahotsav happens here in Varanasi to pay tribute to the river that gives life. This festival lasts for a period of 5 days. You will be amazed at the cultural and traditional vibrancy that this place exhibits. You will fall in love with the fun and colourful dance and music that you can find here.

2. MAHASHIVRATRI - Mahashivratri is the festival that is celebrated in the entire country with a lot of enthusiasm, you will find that this is the time when millions of devotees gather in temples to worship the supreme Lord Shiva as it is one of the grand Varanasi festivals. This is a festival when people from various places visit Varanasi. This festival is celebrated every year on the 14th day of the month of Phalgun, this is also the day which marks the end of the winter season. The procession for this festival begins late in the evening, gets continued for the entire night and finishes early in the morning the next day.

3. HOLI - Holi is actually one of the most important Varanasi festivals. It is celebrated with a lot of pomp and show. This place will make you fall in love with the theme of Holi. You will find various people celebrating Holi by throwing colour in the air happily. In every year with the rest of India, in the month of Phalgun, Varanasi also celebrated Holi in wonderful manner that you will never want to forget in your entire life.

4. DEV DEEPAVALI - This is a festival that is celebrated on the 15th day of the Hindu month of Kartik. 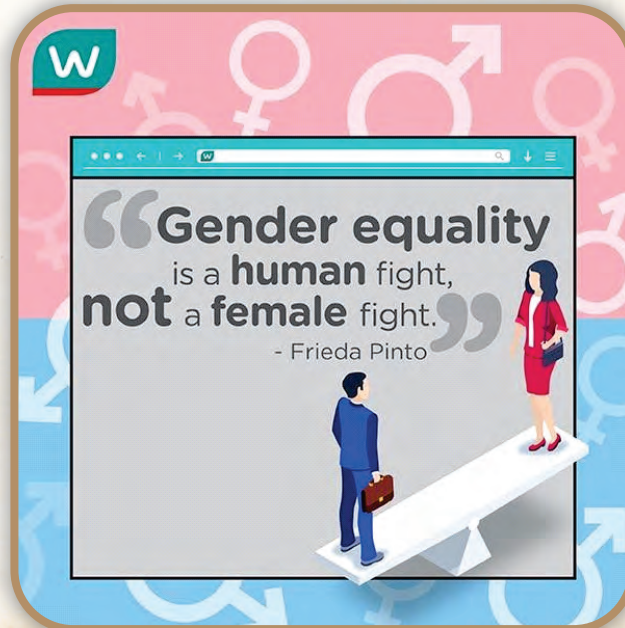
Where women are honored, there the deities are pleased;

You must be wondering why Women's Day is celebrated on 8th March? Well, there is a brief History around it that goes back 109 years. It was in 1909 when a political party of America celebrated 15,000 Women who protested against various issues like low pay scale, equal opportunities, and lack of voting rights in New York city. Originally it was called National Women's Day and as the news spread annual celebration was done across the world but it was Russia who set the March 8th date. It was in 1975 that the United Nation recognized International Women's Day and from 1996 International Women's Day became a theme to celebrate Women in society.

21st century India is filled with progressive and mindful youth. In almost every field of life, gender discrimination is being avoided, moreover, efforts encouraging participation of female members are highly being taken.

India has a vast population, with a relatively stable gender ratio. There are as many females in every region today as there are males. However, this proportion is not being maintained when certain regions, industries or occupations are concerned. This big task of achieving equality thus starts at our homes, when we ask sons to help in cooking, or doing the dishes, and when we teach our daughters basics of finance, and tell them that they too, are responsible for their family's well being. This is how we can achieve gender equality today, and ensure that we have a sustainable future.

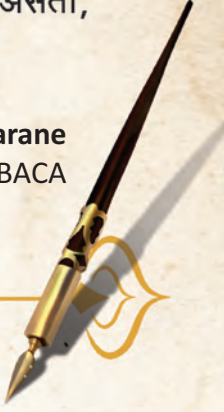

AGENDA: Discussing the implementation of Privatisation of Public Sector Units (PSU's) in India.

3. COUNCIL: UNITED NATIONS ECONOMIC AND SOCIAL COUNCIL. (UNECOSOC)

The chairperson was Dharmil Doshi and Vice-Chairperson was Shreeya Bhattad.

The Economic and Social Council of the United Nations (ECOSOC) is responsible for coordinating the economic, social and related work of UN specialized agencies, their functional committees and regional committees.

The General Assembly, coordinates the economic and social work of the United Nations and the UN family of organizations. As the central forum for discussing

international economic and social issues and for formulating policy recommendations, the Council plays a key role in fostering international cooperation for development. It also consults with non-governmental organizations (NGOs), thereby maintaining a vital link between the United Nations and civil society. The Council has 54 members, elected by the General Assembly for three-year terms. It meets throughout the year and holds a major session in July, during which a high-level meeting of Ministers discusses major economic, social and humanitarian issues.

4. COUNCIL: UNITED NATIONS HUMAN RIGHTS COUNCIL.

AGENDA: Deliberation upon Right to Life and Right to Privacy in the digital world.

The chairperson was Adwait Karvande and Vice-Chairperson was Bianca Chettier.

The United Nations Human Rights Council (UNHRC) is a United Nations body whose mission is to promote and protect human rights around the world. The Council has 47 members elected for staggered three-year terms on a regional group basis. The headquarters of the Council is in Geneva, Switzerland.

The Council investigates allegations of breaches of human rights in United Nations member states, and addresses thematic human rights issues such as freedom of association and assembly, freedom of expression, freedom of belief and religion, women's rights, LGBT rights, and the rights of racial and ethnic minorities.

The Council was established by the United Nations General Assembly on 15 March 2006 to replace the United Nations Commission on Human Rights (UNCHR, herein CHR). The Council works closely with the Office of the High Commissioner for Human Rights (OHCHR) and engages the United Nations special procedures.

5. COUNCIL: International Labor Organisation (ILO)

AGENDA: Assessing Labour Rights of minors under international forum.

The International Labour Organization (ILO) is a United Nations agency whose mandate is to advance social and economic justice through setting international labour standards. Founded in October 1919 under the League of Nations, it is the first and oldest specialised agency of the UN. The ILO has 187 member states: 186 out of 193 UN member states plus the Cook Islands. It is headquartered in Geneva, Switzerland, with around 40 field offices around the world, and employs some 3,381 staff across 107 nations, of whom 1,698 work in technical cooperation programmes and projects.

The ILO's labour standards are aimed at ensuring accessible, productive, and sustainable work

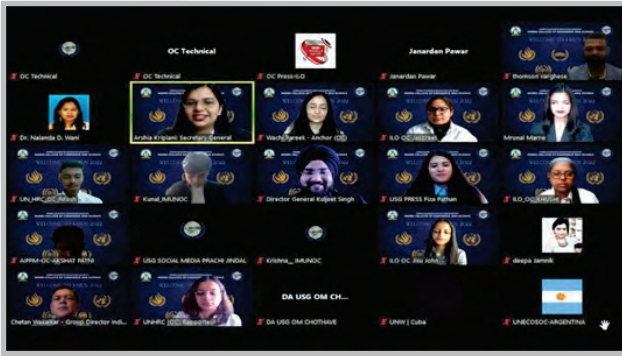
worldwide in conditions of freedom, equity, security and dignity. They are set forth in 189 conventions and treaties, of which eight are classified as fundamental according to the 1998 Declaration on Fundamental Principles and Rights at Work; together they protect freedom of association and the effective recognition of the right to collective bargaining, the elimination of forced or compulsory labour, the abolition of child labour, and the elimination of discrimination in respect of employment and occupation. The ILO is a major contributor to international labour law.

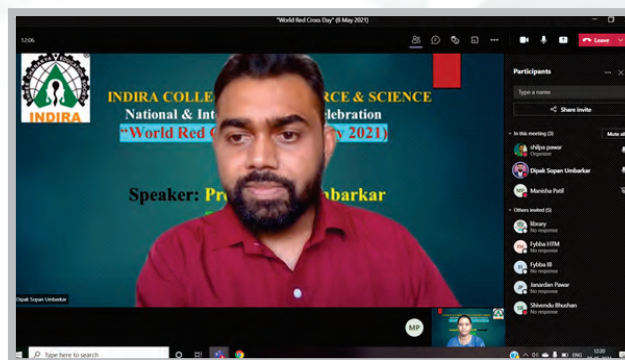


7.4 CELEBRATION OF NATIONAL & INTERNATIONAL DAYS

We by coming together, talk, share our thoughts, exciting ideas in fact everything without any fear of judgment as WE ARE FAMILY.

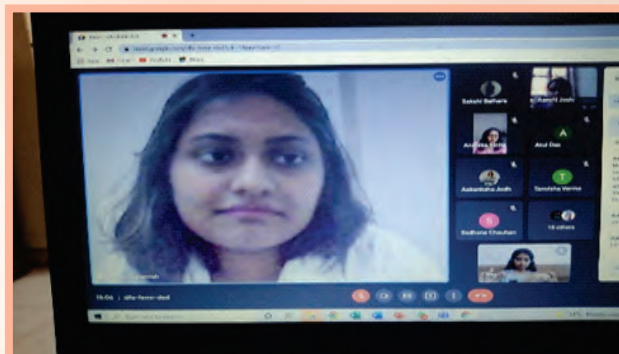

1) Speaker Sessions

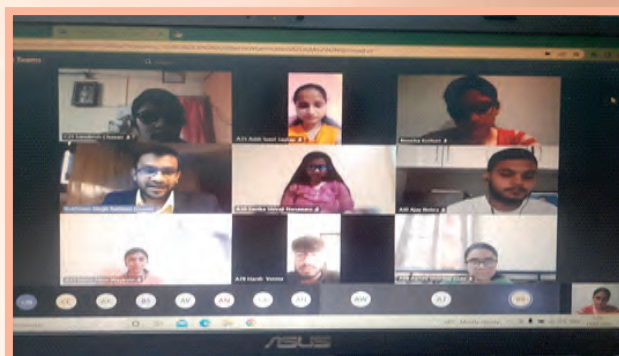
We conduct various informative speaker sessions on different topics to make everyone aware about certain issues and find solutions to overcome them.

b) Another Speaker session on the topic

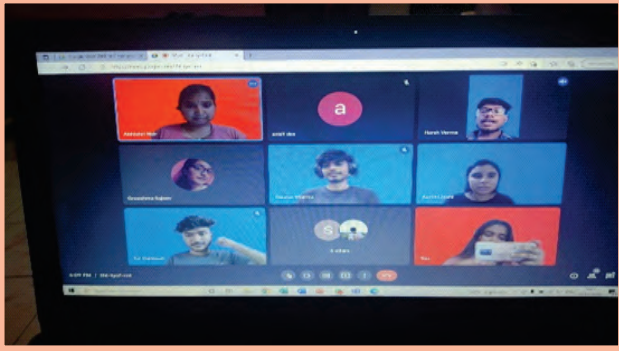

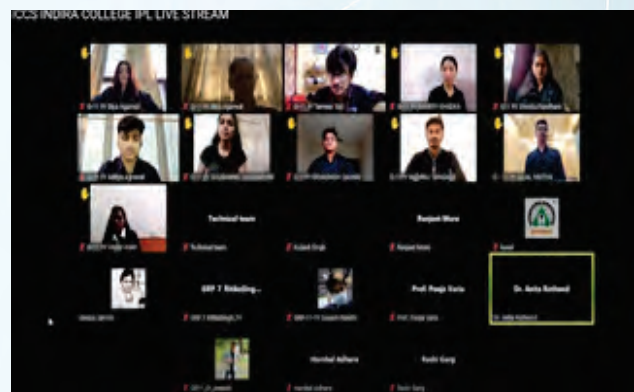
2. Indira Presentation League (IPL)

12. 6 LIBRARY COMMITTEE REPORT

A library authority may appoint a library committee, which is a body consisting of persons who are assigned the job of looking after the library and for transparent and smooth working of library.

a) Members of the Library Committee:

The library committee is formed with the heads of the departments as well as an undergraduate student and a post graduate student, the Principal, the Librarian etc. The Principal is the Chairman of the library committee, and the Librarian is the ex-officio Secretary. The library committee should not be very large. Only those people should be included as members of the library committee who are interested in the library and in this way the membership is restricted within the limit of twenty.

b) Types of Library Committee:

There are mainly two types of library committees

- i) Executive Committee: This committee is most powerful as it has full power over those matters which are delegated to them by the library authority. So, the decision of the library executive committee is final and mandatory. It need not report its decision to the library authority.
- ii) Advisory or Recommendatory Committee: It simply gives proposals which are subject to the approval of the library authority.

• Aims & Objectives:

The ICCS Library designed to achieve the following **broad objectives**:

- 1) To aid in the establishment of a bridge between the Library and the academic fraternity and the institute management.
- 2) To Ensure that all procedures and policies are followed as per the stated rules and regulations lay down by the concerned (UGC, AICTE, NAAC...etc.) authority.
- 3) To advice in matters regarding proposed policies.
- 4) To advise on general development and administration of the library by organizing meeting regularly.
- 5) To provide satisfaction to the users by achieving the goals of library
- 6) To support the functioning of the library
- 7) To act as a channel of communication and dialogue between the Library System and its users.
- 8) To advise and reviews library policies for instruction, resources, services, and the facility.
- 9) To discuss budgetary issues for books, journals, databases, media, etc.

2. To assess the financial support required by the library based on library standard.

5. Bring better understanding of the role of the library among users.
6. To develop the library with achieving the library objectives.
7. To create coordination between income and expenditure.
